1. SUBJECT: Congratulations to the ASI Student Leaders!

The last count I heard about was an impressive total of 1,861 registered voters. 2. SUBJECT; BRIC Updates

DETAIL: The new fencing and pedestrian paths for the overlap period between Phase 1 (Swimming pool) and Phase 2 (BRIC facility) are in place. As the work proceeds, Krista Smith, Director of Recreation, has been in consultation with our campus neighbors about the need to reduce access to Eucalyptus for a 3-week period from 11/5-11/30 due to underground utilities work.
