1. SUBJECT: ASI Team Updates

DETAIL:

ASI has completed the searches for HR Assistant Manager (ASI Human Resources and Program Assistant (Programs & Marketing)). Danielle Sanders will be starting on October 11 as Assistant HR Manager. 2. SUBJECT: BRIC Updates

DETAIL:

Interior wall framing has commenced and by the end of this week all of the concrete slabs will have been poured. While the interior spaces begin to form, the exterior will be wrapped in its "skin" (a combination of glass and other finishes).

One of the 8 new full-time positions for Campus Recreation, in preparation for the BRIC, has been filled. RaShonda Johnson will join the team as Administrative Assistant effective October 11th.
