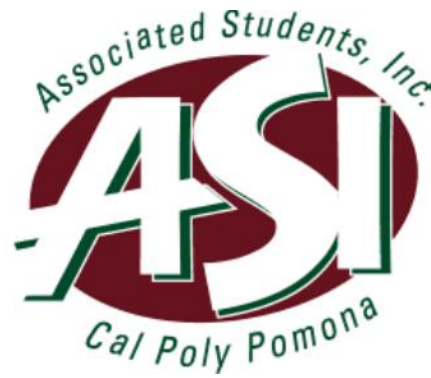
3. Subject: SOMMELIER EXAM ORIENTATION
