1. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation
DETAIL:

Campus Recreation is excited to report 1,412 active Bronco Fitness Center memberships and 1,182 Intramural Sports Leagues participants. The newest program, Bronco Swim, launched on Monday, November 21st, is available to Bronco Fitness Center members 11 hours a week Monday through Friday. With November just around the corner, Campus Recreation has lots of programs scheduled through the remainder of the quarter. The annual Canned Food Drive, which runs through the month of November, extends an eligible member or sponsored guest a complimentary day pass to the Bronco Fitness Center if they donate three non-perishable food items. Tennis (November 1st), Madden video game (November 8th), and Hantis (November 15th) one-day tournaments are still accepting registrations. IM Fit, on November 7th, led by Campus Recreation personal trainers, tests the agility, speed, flexibility and strength of each participant providing measurable benchmarks as they pursue their fitness goals (\$5 for non-members). This quarter's Outdoor Adventure Trip, Kayaking at Cabrillo Beach in San Pedro, will be on Saturday, November 16th. Bootcamp and Junkyard Training are underway, but there are still spots available if you are looking for an engaging and challenging workout. Additionally, the Campus Recreation Exercise and Wellness workshop series hosted a successful session on Nutrition in partnership with Student Health and Counseling Services and Beginner Olympic Lift instruction in October with Advanced Olympic Lift coming up November 14th and 15th. Finally, the department's annual Bench Press Competition will be held November 18th-22nd.
