The Weekend Events Committee is partnering with Housing, BEAT, IHC and the Suites Councils already and we are looking for more sponsors to help make this a truly unique experience. We are looking at bigger headline DJ's, a light show, projection screens, and more. Put the date on your calendar and come to the second largest concert of the year!

Gas Creative Group is continuing to work on the logo designs and is currently putting some of the ideas into digital format. They are planning to have a few solid options of the three key logos, (BSC, ASI and BRIC), that can be shared with the student leaders.

#### **4. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation Updates**

##### **DETAIL:**

It is an exciting and busy spring quarter for Campus Recreation! Starting April 22nd, Intramurals Sports will be hosting leagues for Flag Football, Soccer, Basketball, Tennis and Softball. This quarter, we are piloting a new recruitment process for sports officials. Candidates are required to sign-up for a group interview instead of trainings being open to all interested parties. Top candidates from the interview process will be extended an invitation to in-class and on-field trainings. Final evaluations from these trainings will determine which candidates are extended a position. Our intention is to improve the quality of candidates as well as the retention of our sports officials. A returning element to Intramural Sports is the Captains' Meetings. Currently, each team is required to view an online video, complete their league's quiz and turn it in to Campus Recreation as part of the registration process. The Captains' Meeting will review general league policies and sport specific rules as well as focus on the role of the team captain to reinforce our commitment to safe and fair play.

Fitness will be leading the Walking/Jogging Hour for free on Mondays and Wednesdays from 12pm to 12:50pm. Due to increased demand, Boot Camp will be offered Monday/Wednesday and/or Tuesday/Thursday starting April 15th (1st week is free, 6 week session 2 days/week is \$40 for members and \$50 for non-members). Based on participant feedback, there have been some adjustments to the "Group Exercise" schedule. R.I.P.P.E.D. (Resistance, Intervals, Power, Plyometrics, and Endurance) will be on Mondays and Wednesday at 4:30pm, Spin (indoor cycling) will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 6:30pm and Trim 'n' Tone (high-intensity, interval training) will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 12pm. Campus Recreation's Fitness Team is really excited about the debut of the Educational Clinic Series. Here is the schedule:

All Group Exercise classes and Educational Clinics are available to Bronco Fitness Center members at no charge. Non-members may purchase a day pass to participate.

On May 11th, Outdoor Adventures will be heading to Seal Beach for a Surfing Lesson. This trip, lead in partnership with M & M Surfing, can accommodate up to 30 participants. The trip cost (includes wetsuit and board rental) is \$35 for the 1st 15 sign-ups and \$60 for additional sign-ups.
