ASI Executive Director's Report

1. SUBJECT: BRIC

DETAIL:

- The BRIC is on schedule to open the doors on Thursday, September 25th.
- All full-time positions except the Aquatics Coordinator have been filled.
- Student participation and attendance at the Informational Sessions for the student employment opportunities with ASI Campus Recreation have been overwhelming and the department is anticipating an excellent turnout for the three Job Fair dates.

2. SUBJECT: Bronco Fitness Center Repurpose Project

DETAIL:

- On April 30, 2014 the official bid results were announced for the construction work phase. There were 4 companies that submitted proposals with the low bid coming in at \$116,637.82. This is great news because the bid came in under the estimated budget of \$218,300 for construction. The work to be completed during this phase include: demolition, painting, building the new walls in the locker rooms and installing the new flooring.

3. SUBJECT: Bronco Fitness Center

DETAIL:

- The last monthly billing cycle for the Bronco Fitness Center was completed earlier this week with 1,619 active members.
- The Bronco Fitness Center will be celebrating its contributions to a healthier and happier campus community on Thursday, June 5th beginning at 5:00 p.m.
- The doors will be closing on Friday, June 13th at 7:00 p.m.
- Finalization of the transfer of the majority of the Bronco Fitness Center equipment to the Kinesiology and Health Promotion Department is almost complete. The move will begin Monday, June 16th and be completed by Monday, June 30th.

4. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation

DETAIL:

- Intramural Sports had a solid turnout for league registration.
- Flag Football, Basketball, Soccer, and Softball have a total of 1,187 participants (875 of those unique). Participation is evenly spread across freshmen, sophomore and juniors (219-268), classes with seniors has the most active participants (389).
- Ultimate Frisbee Tournament, Tennis Tournament, Plyometric and Stretching Workshop, IM Fit Challenge, and Pull-up Competition will take part during the month of May.
