DETAIL:

- A group of 15 individuals will be traveling to CSUN to participate in the Grand Opening of their new Student Recreation Center.
- The Student Recreation Center (SRC) is a two-story 138,000-square foot facility, which broke ground in December 2009, will feature a 40-foot indoor rock climbing wall, the tallest and one of only two rock walls in the California State University system. The SRC also will have two outdoor pools, including a 7,500-square-foot pool with three dedicated lap lanes, basketball, volleyball and badminton courts and a comprehensive weight-training and fitness zone with state-of-the-art equipment.

The center will offer a variety of fitness classes, including cardio kickboxing, yoga, Zumba, Pilates and spinning. A boxing studio, indoor jogging track, personal training, nutritional counseling and babysitting services will also be available.

The center is located east of the University Student Union and will be open Monday through Thursday, 6 a.m. to midnight. The SRC will close at 10 p.m. on Fridays and will be open from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. during the weekend.
