ASI Executive Director's Report**

1. SUBJECT: Recreation Center Progress

DETAIL:

- The draft construction drawings were reviewed in detail by the Leadership Team and comments were provided to Leatha Elsdon, our Project Manager.
- An e-mail update was sent to all students to keep them informed and excited about the project.
- ASI's contract with CREW Solutions on pre- and post-opening consulting services for the Recreation Center has been signed.
- CREW Solutions is already working with LPA architects on Group 2 items for the project, per the Extra Service Authorization (ESA).

2. SUBJECT: KUDOS to Gas Creative Group

DETAIL:
