ASI Executive Director's Report**

**1.SUBJECT: CPI-Based Increase for ASI and BSC Fees Effective Summer 2012**

**DETAIL:**

The passage of the Student Opportunities Initiative Fee Referendum (February 5 & 6, 2003) and approval by the University President (February 10, 2003) authorized an annual inflationary adjustment for both the Associated Students Inc. (ASI) and Bronco Student Center (BSC) fees. The annual inflationary adjustment is based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for All Urban Consumers for the Los Angeles- Riverside- Orange County areas, as published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor.

In the event that the annual inflationary increase is 10% or higher, the fee increase is to be presented and voted on by the ASI Senate for the ASI fee (Senate Bill 2005-06:03) and the BSC fee (approved by University on 5/26/09).

The CPI for All Urban Consumers for the LA-Riverside-Orange County areas increased by 2.2% from December, 2010 (Annual Index = 226.639) to December, 2011 (Annual Index = 231.567). Please refer to the attached CPI information from the web site of the Bureau of Labor Statistics, US Department of Labor.

Thus, ASI and BSC fees will increase by the CPI annual inflationary adjustment factor of 2.2%, effective Summer 2012. The adjusted ASI and BSC fees are summarized below:
