ASI Executive Director's Report

1. **SUBJECT: Recreation Center Progress Report**

DETAIL:

- The construction drawings for the Recreation Center are currently in plan check.
- CREW Solutions made arrangements for ASI reps, LPA Architects and Chris Chisler to attend the Vendor Expo at the International Health, Racquetball and Sportsclub Association Conference at the LA Convention Center (IHRSA) on March 15. This gave our group an opportunity to meet major vendors for recreation and fitness equipment and see state-of-the-art equipment that will be out in the market in 3-6 months time. This will be very helpful as we work with CREW Solutions on selecting Group II equipment for the Recreation Center.
- The Financial Plan for the Recreation Center will be an action item for today's Senate meeting. Once approved by the ASI Senate, it will be submitted to the University for approval and transmittal to the Chancellor's Office (CO) for placement on the agenda for the Board of Trustees meeting. In addition to the Financial Plan, the CO also requires the submission of Form PPD 2-7, monthly cash flow report during construction and the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMAX) for the project.

2. **SUBJECT: Personnel Updates**

DETAIL:

- The job announcement for the Director for the Recreation Center has been posted. An Information Session was held at the National Intramurals and Recreation Sports Association (NIRSA) Conference this week and facilitated by CREW Solutions, Powell Velasco and Shelbi Long.
- The search for Accounts Payable Fund Specialist is almost completed and currently being evaluated.
- A search for Program Assistant has been launched. Ashley Simmons has been appointed as Interim Program Assistant until the search is completed. Jackie Lara will be the Interim Project Assistant for RPM.

3. SUBJECT: ASI and BSC Fees for 2012 – 13

DETAIL:

- The Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased by 2.1% as of January, 2012. ASI and BSC fees per student will be adjusted by the 2.1% inflation rate effective Summer, 2012, as follows:

5. SUBJECT: RPM Updates

DETAIL:

- First Friday is **Urban Showcase!** Combining the best of the API Center's annual event and a throwback to the days of Session A, this First Friday event is going to be packed with hip hop culture. From 6:00-8:00pm in the University Park will be a food and art fair as well as spoken word performances and a DJ workshop. At 8:00pm creator of the Brooklyn Hip Hop Festival, Wes Jackson, will be giving a lecture on the history of Hip Hop. The showcase starts at 9:00pm in Ursa Major with student performances and will be headlined by LA battle rapper Dumbfoundead and artist Rocky Rivera. The entire event goes from 6pm to midnight.
- There is a new exhibit in the Atrium Space of the Bronco Exhibit Gallery titled the Water Diamond Project. Following our sustainability focus for this area of the gallery, this unique exhibit will be up for about 9 months while the Morning Glory vines snake their way up the chains to create a living indoor garden and art piece. We will be posting "watering times" for students to come and join us while we water our new flower friends. Additionally, we have included a time-lapse camera that will take digital photos every 3 hours so that we can create a movie of the plant growth!

Almost 80 students responded to the survey, which is a significant portion of our student ASI staff and leaders.
