ASI Executive Director's Report**

1. SUBJECT: Recreation Center Update

DETAIL:

- A teleconference was held with CREW Solutions to discuss the proposed Group 2 Equipment list and budget.
- Powell, Barny, Shelbi, I and LPA reps will be attending the International Health, Racquet and Sportsclub Association (IHRSA) Vendor Exhibit on March 15 to meet prospective fitness equipment vendors and take a closer look at equipment and system options for the Recreation Center.
- A meeting was recently held to discuss options for project sequencing. Attendees included Dr. Perky Vetter (KHP Chair) Doug Freer, Leatha Elsdon, Tom Jones (CW Driver) and myself. The meeting resulted in the conclusion that closing pool access for Fall 2012 and Winter 2013 would be the best option from a project schedule perspective and also to minimize the “dust and inconvenience” nuances for the academic program. Dr. Vetter will be consulting with the Dean and Provost to confirm their concurrence with this option.
- We have been advised by the Chancellor's Office and the University to be ready to go to the BOT for the approval of the Financial Plan at the May meeting, in stead of the July meeting. This will move up the work of the staff by almost 2 months and required approvals from the ASI Senate and University to early April.
- The University has received word from the Chancellor's Office about a possible 3% cut in FTE enrollment for 2013-14. This will impact ASI and BSC fee revenue during the year that we are preparing for the opening of the Recreation Center. This will be integrated in the Financial Plan assumptions for the project.
