1. **SUBJECT: Recreation Center Progress Report**

DETAIL:

- In consultation with campus administrators, a decision was made to install Cat6 (instead of Cat5e) cabling throughout the Recreation Center. This will involve an additional cost outlay of \$11,000 and provide the advantage of enabling the facility to support state of the art fitness equipment and technology.
- The project team has confirmed that we are on track for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Gold certification which is one step up from the original expectation to qualify for LEED Silver.

2. **SUBJECT: Personnel Updates**
