1. SUBJECT: BRIC Project Update

DETAIL: Thank you for participating in the BRIC photo opportunities on Tuesday, 9/11. As you are all aware, construction has officially started and weekly construction meetings with Leatha Elsdon, campus Project Manager, and the CW Driver crew are in full swing.

Pedestrian signage is up. The current swimming pool has been drained and will be turned over to CW Driver by October 1. Demolition work is ongoing.

A meeting with campus neighbors is planned for the week of 10/15 to go over the overlap period for Phase 1 (pool and deck construction) and Phase 2 (BRIC facility construction) of the project.

2. SUBJECT: Bronco Student Center Debt Refinancing

DETAIL: I am pleased to share that good news that our request for the refinancing or refunding of the 2004A Series bonds for the Bronco Student Center was successfully issued by the CSU Chancellor's Office. Due to favorable bond rates, the refunding yielded net present value savings of approximately \$245,000 for our organization in terms of future principal and interest payments on the outstanding bond indebtedness.

3. SUBJECT: Audited Reports for 2011-12

DETAIL: The Audit Committee met on 9/20 and the audited reports for Fiscal Year 2011-12 were presented by Vicenti, Lloyd and Stutzman, our current audit firm. The outcome was another unqualified audit opinion for ASI, which is the best outcome that any organization can achieve. The auditors will present the audited report to the ASI Senate at the 10/11 meeting and Phil Sales, student representative on the Committee, will also provide an update.

4. **SUBJECT: Appointment of Maria Lisa Flemington as Interim Programming Coordinator**
DETAIL: ML Flemington will serve in the capacity of Interim Programming Coordinator while we are identifying a potential candidate for Interim Program Assistant. A search for Programming Coordinator will also be conducted.

5. **SUBJECT: What's New in the BSC**
DETAIL: In our continued efforts to serve the needs of our students, I thank the ASI team for their coordination of opening of Qdoba Mexican Grill in the BSC Food Court, addition of two meeting rooms (Atria and Perseus), hiring of additional staff in Campus Recreation, the re-carpeting of the Ursa Major lobby and hallway area, installation of hand dryers in all the BSC restrooms and several changes in Games Room Etc. to include console gaming, microwaves, new artwork and furniture.

6. **SUBJECT: Update from BOT Meeting on 9/18 and 9/19**
DETAIL: The CSU Board of Trustees discussed strategies to address the possible trigger cut of \$250 million if Prop 30 does not pass, as follows:
 - Another tuition increase effective January, 2013
 - Increase of non-resident tuition
 - A graduation incentive fee
 - A course repeat fee
 - A third tier tuition fee (17 units or more)
 - Change to health care benefits cost-sharing between employer and employees
 - Increase in system-wide administrative efficiencies
 - Campus specific strategies on cost reduction

7. **SUBJECT: ASI Internal Procedures and Timelines**
