**3. SUBJECT: Audited Financial Report for FY 2010-11**

- The audit for the 2010-11 year has been completed by Vicenti, Lloyd and Stutzman (VLS) with the coordination and support of ASI Business Services. The audited financial report will be submitted to the University and CSU Chancellor's Office in compliance with the September 30 submission deadline.
- I am pleased to report that we received an "unqualified audit opinion" which is the best outcome for a financial audit. VLS will present the audit report to the ASI Senate at a scheduled meeting next month. I encourage you to bring your questions to this presentation.

**4. SUBJECT:** Chancellor's Office Training on CA Senate Bill 8

- Chris Helwick, CSU Chief Counsel, conducted training for CSU auxiliary managers in preparation for the CSU Auxiliaries Transparency and Accountability Act (Senate Bill 8) which becomes effective January 1, 2012. Powell Velasco, Barny Peake and I attended the two hour training at the CSU Chancellor's Office.
- The legislation requires the disclosure of records to requestors (unless a specific exemption applies), an acknowledgment within 10 days of receipt, process, , allowable charges, etc.
- Dennis Miller, HR Director for CPP Foundation, has been designated as the campus coordinator for SB 8 requests for auxiliary records.

**5. SUBJECT:** Now, Then & Always Art Exhibit

- The art exhibit will be featured thru November 4, 2011 in the designated exhibit space in the BSC in celebration of LGBTQIA Month in October.

1. ASI Goals and Initiatives for the year
  - a. Today I will be presenting the finalized goals and initiatives for the year
2. CSSA next CSSA meeting Oct 14-16<sup>th</sup>
  - a. 2015 Stability Plan was discussed
    - i. Fine points of this include a potential increase in student tuition (of a few dollars) in order to provide stable funding for CSSA's advocacy efforts
  - b. Presidential Selection and Executive Compensation
    - i. The Board of Trustees sought out the change how they select University Presidents. One of the amendments gives the campus the choice of whether a campus visit is necessary during the interview process.
      1. The CSSA took a stance against this change, because campus visits are essential to see if the candidate is a "fit" for the campus. San Luis Obispo voted down 3 candidates after a campus visit because they weren't a good fit (although they were qualified on paper)
      2. The proponents for the change wanted it to occur because there is a potential to lose candidates out of fear for losing their job (credibility, etc) after being publicly announced as a candidate for a position.
  - c. CSSA Made in the CSU Campaign
    - i. We split up into functional regions and discussed different campaign strategies for the Made in the CSU Campaign
  - d. We reviewed the CSSA legislative positions and priorities
    - i. <http://csustudents.capwiz.com/csustudents/issues/bills/> for a list of the bills we support and lobby for
  - e. Gainful Employment Regulations
    - i. There are new national regulations being discussed on the dispersal of Federal Aid Pell Grants. The changes include a clause which requires educators to meet a threshold percentage of graduates who get a job after graduation.

f. AB 970- Student Fee Transparency Act

- i. This new Act seeks to force the Board of Trustees to have a waiting period of about 11 months, including 3 months of open meeting discussions, before passing a new fee increase

3. Campus Activities

a. Foundation

- i. The Foundation BOD met on Tuesday. Next BOD meeting Nov 17<sup>th</sup>
  1. We passed a resolution accepting all of the liabilities and responsibilities of the University Education Trust which dissolved on Monday. The Auxiliary will be seeking BOT approval for official dissolution. As soon as that occurs, the University Foundation will be in charge of UET's investments
  2. The Foundation edited its insurance policies and will follow a self-funding model
  3. The Campus Dining Services hired a consultant to advise changes to the Dining Services Master Plan. Changes will include what to do with the "Old Vista," whether it will be feasible to add a new dining venue near AG Valley, and whether the services currently provided are sufficient in the Campus Marketplace and BSC Center Court.
  4. We bought the College of AG a truck
