**3. SUBJECT: BRIC Updates**

**DETAIL:**

- BRIC construction is progressing.
- Recently, the Campus Recreation Team visited Cal Poly SLO, CSU Long Beach, and CSU Northridge (all opened in the last 2 years) for intensive tours and information gathering/sharing to support the various planning phases for the BRIC.
- Over the next few weeks, the Campus Recreation Team and ASI Leadership Team, with support from CREW Solutions, will be finalizing the Group II (furniture and equipment) list, preparing the RFP for the software package, drafting facilities, membership and program policies, and updating the timeline for non-student staff searches and onboarding.

#### **4. SUBJECT: Bronco Student Center Space Study and Energy Use Assessment**

##### **DETAIL:**

A total of 3,482 surveys were completed as of December 7, 2012. The preliminary findings were presented to the ASI Leadership Team and LPA Architects by Brailsford and Dunlavey, consultant. A follow-up meeting with ASI staff will be scheduled this month.

On December 18, a BSC walk-thru with LPA was completed and historical energy use data was also shared with LPA for review.

### **1. SUBJECT: Sorority (Delta Sigma Theta) Suspension**

**DETAIL:** Delta Sigma Theta has been suspended through the end of 2015. It was said that they engaged in hazing activities such as, “sleep deprivation, corporal punishment and the unauthorized collection of dues from individuals who were not yet members of the organization.” Whether or not the sorority is permitted to return will depend on the behavior of its members during the suspension. If they are permitted to return they will not be allowed to recruit new members for two years. Once the two years are over and they begin recruiting again, they will be on probation for the following three years.

As of right now, twelve students are facing disciplinary action.
