ASI Executive Director's Report

1. SUBJECT: BRIC Updates

DETAIL:

- We are hosting 3 finalists for the Intramural Sports Coordinator position next week
- Candidates for remaining BRIC positions will be on campus each week through the end of February
- The implementation of the new membership management software, Fusion by Innosoft, has started and is being done in coordination with SAITS and I&IT.
- Exterior skin installation is progressing on the BRIC with most of the metal and glass completed on the 3rd floor. The placement of stone on the 1st and 2nd levels are in the early stages
- We are gearing up for March's First Friday "Rec Fest" launching the BRIC campaign and countdown to the Grand Opening

The CSU Chancellor and representatives from the Chancellor's Office, University administrators, senior auxiliary managers and service providers added up to a total of 600 conference attendees.
- Chancellor White acknowledged the primary role of CSU auxiliaries and encouraged creativity and innovation as we plan for the future. He reminded us that the CSU will not go back to where it was in the past in terms of state funding levels.
