**ASI Executive Director's Report**

**1. SUBJECT: Bronco Fitness Center (BFC) Repurposing Project**

**DETAIL:**

- A kick-off meeting with CPP Facilities Planning and Management, LPA Architects and ASI Directors is scheduled for January 29, 2014.
- The project is being fast tracked so that the space will be ready for use at the start of Fall Quarter 2014.
- The BFC is scheduled to close on June 16 and construction is scheduled to start on July 1.

**2. SUBJECT: Energy Use Assessment for Bronco Student Center (BSC)**

**DETAIL:**

- The Summary Energy Use Assessment final report is scheduled to be issued by the end of January.
- In October 2012, ASI engaged LPA, Inc. to evaluate the existing energy use of the BSC and to develop and evaluate measures that can reduce the energy use and cost associated with the facility.
- The scope of LPA's work included:
  - a. Evaluation of four years of past energy use and energy cost data, provided by BSC staff
  - b. Review of design documentation for the BSC;
  - c. Tour of BSC facilities and identification of energy efficiency opportunities;
    - Development of specific and general recommendations for improving energy performance of the BSC.

The energy assessment efforts were conducted in conjunction with a larger review of the uses of the BSC and master planning for the future of the facility. The energy assessment information gathered provides the design team with a framework for recommending energy efficiency improvements for both the short and long term needs of the BSC. The overall goal is to reduce long term energy use and facility operations costs

The proposed energy efficiency improvements are intended to be flexible and adaptable as the BSC uses and needs evolve over time.

### **DETAIL:**

- Campus Recreation programs currently have 1650 active members.
- Intramural Sports is facilitating 104 teams for league play in basketball and volleyball with 825 participants.
- Badminton and Dodge Ball tournaments are scheduled to take place in February.
- Form First Workouts with personal trainers are beginning this week and is free to all BFC members.
- In partnership with Student Health and Counseling Services, "Monday Mile" is a new spin on Walking/Jogging Hour. Free for all participants, a one mile course has been mapped out and tracking mileage is encouraged in order to be eligible for various prizes.
- The Triathlon is scheduled to be held the week on February 3<sup>rd</sup> with the swimming leg of the event to take place in the new BRIC pool.
- Three Campus Rec Student Staff members have been asked to support the NIRSA Region VI Basketball Tournaments at Eastern Washington University February 21<sup>st</sup> through the 23<sup>rd</sup>.
- BRIC exterior (stone, metal and glass) is well underway.
- BRIC furniture and fitness equipment are in final stages of approval.
- BRIC tours will take place during Homecoming Weekend – February 8<sup>th</sup> from 2pm to 3pm. Additional tours will take place during March's First Friday RecFest, kicking off the countdown to the grand opening.

1. Pizza with the Provost:
  - a. This past meeting, we hosted a pizza with the provost event to get student feedback regarding the quarter to semester conversion. The dialogue ended up taking up the entire meeting time, so I was unable to give my ASI report orally, but I sent my report for the clubs to review electronically.
  - b. Some feedback received was the concern that this “extra” time to absorb information could end up really being wasted because there is less pressure to accomplish things in a short amount of time. This was feedback from a student who transferred from a semester system and truly preferred the quarter system.
  - c. One question asked was if the number of labs would be affected? Due to the hands on learn by doing curriculum we’ve had is really what’s been most effective for Agriculture majors.
  - d. Another topic brought up was if the polytechnic spirit would stay with the new curriculum.
  - e. One conflict that came up was seasonal classes and how they’d be affected. Especially those that are only offered once every two years, making it difficult to acquire classes.
  - f. Students raised the question if class capacity would increase since we would have some seasonal classes? And since less classes would be offered per year, class capacity needed to increase to accommodate the number of students trying to graduate.
  - g. A question of winter intersession would be implemented? This was brought up by a student who had previously attended a semester system school and claimed that those intersession were the only way she could attain the classes needed to transfer in a timely manner.
  - h. The provost made the suggestion that the number of sections may increase.

2. Homecoming:
  - a. The deadline for food sale was last Friday. A few clubs have contacted me about participating. I was able to get an extension until Wednesday due to my poor communication with La 'Keisha. I also wanted to get an assessment of which clubs and organizations would like to participate in the decorating competition.
