**ASI Executive Director's Report**

**1. SUBJECT: BRIC Project Progress**

**DETAIL:**

- BRIC construction is progressing and staying on schedule.
- Installation of Skylight Glazing System above the lobby and climbing wall areas has begun.
- The large scaffolding system towering above all three courts and the MAC is complete.
- ASI and the University will be inspecting the ceiling tiles, tubular skylights and artificial lighting systems before the contractors disassemble the scaffolding later this month.
- Rubber flooring for the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> floor, ceiling tile and finishes for the racquetball courts are being delivered this week.
- The exterior stone installation is coming together beautifully. The contractors will begin grouting the west elevation and start to set the east elevation this week.

**3. SUBJECT: Programs & Marketing**

**DETAIL:**

#### **4. SUBJECT: Bronco Fitness Center Repurposing Project**

##### **DETAIL:**

- A kick off meeting with CPP Facilities Planning and Management, LPA Architects and ASI Directors occurred on January 29, 2014. At this meeting LPA presented:
  - Materials, finishes and color samples for carpet and paint
  - Furniture options were presented for the first and second floors respectively – this consisted of study, lounge and meeting room furniture options
- ASI Leadership group provided comments and feedback to LPA
- A follow up meeting has been scheduled for February 13 to review the comments and options requested by the ASI Leadership group
- Timeline – the project is being fast tracked so that the space will be ready for use at the start of Fall Quarter 2014.
- The BFC is scheduled to close on June 16 and construction is scheduled to start on July 1.
