**ASI Executive Director's Report**

**1. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation Updates**

**DETAIL:**

- ASI Campus Recreation will be hosting two finalists for the Aquatics Coordinator on campus next week (October 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>).
- The deadline for Fall Intramural Sports registration was Thursday, October 15<sup>th</sup>. Volleyball leagues will debut in the BRIC with soccer and flag football hosted on the outdoor fields.
- 12,062 students (53% of the eligible population) have registered for their membership to the BRIC as of Wednesday, October 15<sup>th</sup> at 4:44pm. During the week (Monday through Thursday), the BRIC is averaging approximately 3,000 member check-ins each day with over 49,300 check-ins in its first 20 days of operation.
- The Adventure program, in partnership with REI, had to reschedule the Kayak/Stand-up Paddleboard trip scheduled for Saturday, October 11<sup>th</sup> due to inclement weather. When the rescheduled date is announced, an additional 10 spots to the original 12 spots that sold out will open up.

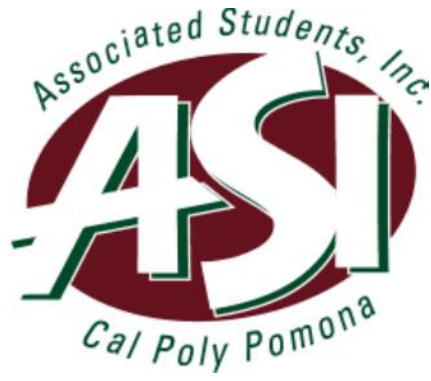
1. Subject: Pumpkin Festival is this weekend, October 18 & 19

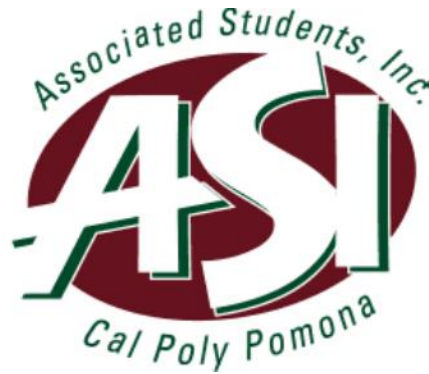
### Personal Updates
