ASI Executive Director's Report

1. SUBJECT: Children's Center Updates

DETAIL:

- Congratulations to Celeste Salinas on her appointment as the Director for the Children's Center. Celeste is now a University Employee.
- The Children's Center and Arches received a Kellogg Legacy Book Grant, which will allow our low income families to receive up to \$250/quarter in Financial Aid for textbooks. Approximately 40 student parents from the Children's Center will receive grants

2. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation

DETAIL:

- Over 12,600 assessed students have signed up to use the BRIC which is 56% of the eligible population.
- Intramural Sports fall registration numbers totaled over 1,000 unique participants this quarter compared to 766 in Fall 2013.
- We have reintroduced the Residential Volleyball league for on-campus residents with 13 teams and over 175 participants.
- The Adventures team has led 488 participants through the Climbing Wall Orientation and of those participants 266 have passed the top rope assessment and 22 have passed the lead climbing assessment.
- The Fitness team has completed 250 boxing orientations (required to use open recreation hours in Studio B).
- As of October 20th, we have recorded more than 1600 check-ins for group fitness classes and our certified personal trainers have provided 52 personal training sessions.

3. SUBJECT: Implementation of Title IX

DETAIL:

- This past June, the CSU issued Executive Orders 1095, 1096 and 1097 in response to the Campus Sexual Violence Elimination Act (the SaVE Act) and related guidance from the US Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights addressing Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972. In addition, Executive Order 1098 was also issued to supersede Executive Order 1073 on Student Conduct Procedures.
- These directives protect all from sex discrimination, including sexual harassment and sexual violence, as well as retaliation against a person who has or is believed to have exercised his/her rights within the scope of these regulations.
- The University has designated Sharon Reiter, AVP for Human Resources as Title IX Coordinator.
- Training has been provided to most of the full-time staff and plans are underway to provide a summary of basic information to the ASI student team members.
- We plan to collaborate with the University on training of ASI students when on-line training is available.
- ASI personnel policies will also be updated accordingly.
