ASI Executive Director's Report

1. SUBJECT: Student Activities & Programs

DETAIL:

- The Association of College Unions International (ACUI) Region I Conference was held last week in La Verne.
 - Several BSC staff and 2 students attended.
 - Approximately 150 other professionals and students throughout the region attended.
 - ASI delegation presented 7 educational sessions.
 - 2 Students from the Games Room co-presented 1 educational session.

2. SUBJECT: BSC Updates

DETAIL:

- The former Vending Machine area next to the Games Room and Bronco Copy n' Mail is being converted for Foundation Dining to use as a catering office and prep area.
- Microwaves from the Games Room have been moved to the south end of the Center Court area by Peet's Coffee.
- Vending Machines next to the Games Room have been relocated to the Solaris hallway (3 machines) and 1 Pepsi machine has been relocated next to the Bank of America ATM.

3. SUBJECT: BEAT

DETAIL:

- The National Association of Campus Activities (NACA) West Regional Conference will be in Portland, Oregon this week.
- Two staff and two BEAT student leaders will be attending.
- NACA provides opportunities to see college performers (musicians, comedians, poets, and lecturers) live.
- Provides opportunities to talk with the performers' agencies and representatives about bringing them to campus.
- There are also educational sessions and opportunities to work with other campuses to book performers at discount prices through block booking acts.

4. SUBJECT: Marketing, Design and PR Updates

DETAIL:

- Congratulations to our MDPR Team. They received Graphic Design Awards at ACUI Region 1 Competition:
 - 1st Place, Banners/Large Scale Media – Student Tim Neumann, Humans vs. Zombies Banners
 - 3rd Place, Multipage Documents – Student Chris Arellano, 2012-2013 Annual Report
 - 3rd Place, Banners/Large Scale Media – Professional Jon Wong, BSC Campaign

5. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation Updates

DETAIL:

- Intramural Sports fall registration numbers totaled over 1,000 unique participants this quarter compared to 766 in Fall 2013.
- We have reintroduced the Residential Volleyball league for on-campus residents with 13 teams and over 175 participants.
- To date, 12,986 assessed students have signed up to use the BRIC, which is 57% of the eligible population, and 173 pad members.
- There are currently 300 individuals that use the pool daily.
- Aquatics is in the process of hiring Head Lifeguards to help support the new winter programs, which are in development.
- The Adventures Team is hosting a special event entitled Dive and Climb. Scheduled for the evening of Friday, November 21st at 6:00 p.m. Activities will include a screening of Valley Uprising, Yosemite's Rock Climbing Revolution, followed by special late night climbing events after hours in the BRIC from 10:00pm to 12am.
- The Adventures Team has led 488 participants through the Climbing Wall Orientation. Of those participants, 266 people have passed the top rope assessment and 22 people have passed the lead climbing assessment.
- The Fitness Team has completed 250 boxing orientations (required to use open recreation hours in Studio B).
- As of October 20th, more than 1600 check-ins for group fitness classes have been recorded.
- Our certified personal trainers have provided 52 personal training sessions.
