1. **Subject: Care Packages for the Community**

2. **Subject: President's Meeting**

Details: Science Council holds two mandatory President's Meetings each quarter. The next, and last, one of the quarter is on December 3, 2014 at 6:00pm in 8-48. Clubs must send their President or another executive board member to the meeting in order to remain in good standing. This is a team building experience, where SC clubs compete against each other to be the 2015 Science Olympic Champions. Competitions include trivia and problem solving, physical activities, and an obstacle course. Each club is able to have up to two teams of six to represent them, at \$5 per participant. This includes their participation fee, lunch, and a t-shirt. Spectators can also attend the event for the same cost, covering a spectator fee, lunch, and a t-shirt as well.
