ASI Executive Director's Report

1. SUBJECT: BSC Facility Updates

DETAIL:

- Last week the second floor drain pipes from the Ursa Minor restrooms were leaking into the Eridanus Lounge light fixtures, due to the old age of the original galvanized drain pipes. ASI Facilities staff explored two solutions to repair the line and opted to insert a fiberglass sleeve into the pipe that would seal it from the inside. This option will not require any demolition and involve less time and money.
- Several times in the past month, the lobby elevator has started to smoke and several repairs have been done to the elevator. The elevator shut down this past weekend and was repaired this Monday, 1/12.
- ASI will be expanding the digital bulletin boards in the BSC this winter, to provide more visibility for the marketing of events and activities. Three new screens will be added to Solaris Lounge and two will be added in the Games Room.
- Several of the informational LCD screens hanging throughout the BSC have not been on for the past few weeks. A component of the Visix system hardware failed and we are in the process of getting a replacement to get the system back up and running. A completion date has yet to be determined.

2. SUBJECT: Student Activities & Programs

DETAIL:

- We just wrapped up a successful January First Friday event, Winter POOLOOZA, on January 9th. Students enjoyed various activities at the BRIC pool and then comedian Sara Schaefer and a screening of Guardians of the Galaxy in the BSC. Total attendance was about 520 students.
- February's First Friday is on Friday, February 6th and will be CPP's Got Talent hosted by B.E.A.T. The event begins at 7pm in Ursa Major.

3. SUBJECT: Games Room, Etc.

DETAIL:

- The Games Room purchased 10 new lounge chairs for the TV Lounge and will be installing a new TV in the space as well.
- There are also 10 new gaming chairs in the Xbox area.

- The Lost & Found Auction on Tuesday, January 13th raised \$576 for scholarships.

4. SUBJECT: Financial Services

DETAIL:

- Financial Services is actively seeking 1-2 temporary Accounting Analysts. In conjunction with Human Resources, will be reviewing resumes and conducting interviews with qualified candidates. We are hoping to fill the position before the end of January to assist in our budgeting and year-end activities.

5. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation

DETAIL:

- As of January 5th, 13,599 students have registered for their BRIC membership (approximately 62% of the eligible population).
- Member Services is recording an average of 2,130 daily check-ins (Monday thru Thursday).
- The BRIC will be open holiday hours on Saturday, January 17th and Sunday, January 18th (10am-6pm) and closed on Monday, January 19th resuming regular operating hours on Tuesday, January 20th.
- Operating hours for the pool have adjusted slightly. Monday thru Thursday the pool is staffed 7am to 10pm, Fridays from 7am to 9pm, Saturdays and Sundays 10am to 9pm. The pool is open for recreational swim and related programs except during KHP classes scheduled Mondays and Wednesdays 10am to 12pm and 1pm to 3pm, Tuesdays 2 to 4pm and Thursday 10am to 12pm and 2 to 4pm.
- Campus Recreation programs are also in full swing.
- Fitness heated up the courts with 75 participants for Zumba Jam on Tuesday night.
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- Group Fitness Classes have expanded to 52 classes each week (33% increase from the fall quarter) with new formats including Piloxing, TRX, Meditation & Kickbox Circuit.
- Intramural Sports is moving inside for winter leagues offering indoor soccer, volleyball and basketball with divisions for men, women and co-rec. Several tournaments will be offered throughout the quarter including IM Fit (1/21 from 6-8pm), Quidditch (2/6 from 4-7p), racquetball (2/20 from 4-7p), tennis (2/27 from 4-7p) and March Madness (online starting 2/15).
- Campus Recreation has launched the trial for the Sports Club Program with the following clubs participating: Table Tennis, MMA, Broncettes, Ultimate, Badminton, Rugby, Archery and Cycling.
- Campus Recreation has resumed the search for an Aquatics Coordinator and ASI HR is accepting applications from qualified candidates.

6. SUBJECT: Human Resources

DETAIL:

- Danielle Sanders, Assistant Manager for HR, is scheduled to be on maternity leave effective February 1. Arrangements have been made to bring in Yolanda Palomarez as “temp” from an agency to assist with ADP implementation for benefits and the performance management system as well as other HR projects.
