Meeting Regarding Process for Funding Requests from The Green Initiative Fund (TGIF)
March 11, 2015

1. All funding requests for TGIF will be completed using the ASI Mid-Year Budget Request template and submitted to the ASI Treasurer. The Mid-Year Budget Request template shall include the following:
 - a. Budget Request Form
 - b. Line Item Explanation
 - c. Program Justification (Per attached)
2. The ASI Treasurer shall refer requests for TGIF funding to the Sustainability Committee, which serves as an advisory body to the Finance Committee, and coordinate with the Secretary of Sustainability accordingly.
3. The Secretary of Sustainability shall place the funding request as an agenda item for the next scheduled meeting of the Sustainability Committee as a Discussion Item and coordinate with the requesting group on:
 - a. Completion of the attached questionnaire
 - b. Attendance of the scheduled meeting, and
 - c. Arrangements for the presentation of the funding request at the meeting
4. The funding request becomes an Action Item at the next meeting of the Sustainability Committee. The motion shall be “to advise the Finance Committee to consider the funding request from TGIF”, without reference to the amount to be funded.
5. On the advice of the Sustainability Committee, the ASI Treasurer shall place the funding request on the agenda for the Finance Committee as a Discussion Item. The ASI Treasurer shall coordinate with the requesting group on the presentation of the funding aspects of the request to the Finance Committee.
6. The ASI Treasurer shall place the funding request on the next meeting of the Finance Committee as an Action Item. The Finance Committee shall take action on funding requests that are less than \$2,500 and recommend to the ASI Senate any funding requests for \$2,500 and over.
7. The ASI Treasurer shall coordinate the placement of funding requests for \$2,500 and over on the ASI Senate agenda, with the ASI Vice President. The ASI Treasurer shall coordinate with the requesting group on an abbreviated presentation of the funding request to the ASI Senate.
