1. Campus Planning

- a. As many students have been hearing, there are rumors about campus planning and renovations. I attended an open forum that discussed what the plans were and was able to get some feedback on whether or not the students wanted this change. Currently, the plan is to cut out a decent amount of the horse pastures in order to relocate our current residence halls. This was explained to students as the primary location of choice out of 21 other locations. Students expressed their concerns about the buildings encroaching on what they feel is a huge part of their classroom. Students explained that the section that is planned to be repurposed is used to actually try and help reduce the cost for the university to take care of the horses that we currently have. As some of us may know, our university has an agreement with the Kellogg foundation that requires us to take care of a certain number of horses in order for us to keep this land as an educational institution. Many students have expressed their concerns with this location and have planned organized, peaceful protests against this location. I have requested to be involved in the discussion of this topic and will try to keep you all as informed as I can.

2. Greek Leadership Summit

- a. On March 4th, Greeks were invited to a Leadership Forum which hosted many guest speakers and discussed topics such as Robert's Rules, recruitment, social media and how it affects us, resume building, interviewing tips, applying to graduate school and many more applicable topics to help them navigate their next few years and beyond.
