1. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation

DETAIL

- Splash Into Spring hosted at the BRIC Pool last Friday, April 10th was a success. In collaboration with SA&P, InterHall Council (IHC), and Music Entertainment Industry Club (M.E.I.C.), this event was designed as a pool party and featured Cal Poly's musical talent, an Open Mic night component as well as slacklining, water volleyball, deck games, free food, giveaways and an iPad Mini opportunity drawing. 392 students attended with 133 coming to the BRIC Pool for the first time and 39 visiting the BRIC for the first time.

- The computer cart in Ursa Major has been the first to receive the Solid State Drive upgrade. Ursa Major now boots up from completely powered off to fully ready and on the desktop in 25 seconds from the previous 1 minute. Programs now also load much quicker and are much more responsive.
