2. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation

DETAIL

- As of May 6th, 14,585 Assessed Students have signed up for the BRIC. This represents 69.2% of all eligible Assessed Students (21,091).
- Intramural Sports is in its third week of Spring leagues with 2,368 participations and 1,057 unique participants.
- Registration is open for three Intramural Sports tournaments.
 - Badminton (5/15)
 - Track and Field (5/22)
 - Inner-tube Water Polo (5/29)
- Fitness is offering new specialty workshops this quarter.
 - Three martial arts workshops (4/24, 5/1, 5/8) have more than 25 participants registered.
 - Three of the Olympic Lifting workshops (4/17, 5/8, 5/29) were completely full prior to the registration deadline.
 - Group fitness classes remain popular with more than 2,500 participant check-ins through week 5 of the spring quarter.
 - Precor cardio equipment has logged 13,501 workouts since March 30, 2015.
