ASI Executive Director's Report

1. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation

DETAIL

- Strong Broncos Competition is next week Monday, May 18 through Thursday, May 22. Additionally, in partnership with Student Health and Counseling Services, Campus Recreation will host Bronco Fitness Expo on Tuesday, May 19 from 5pm to 10pm. All BRIC members are invited to participate in a variety of free demos, learn about Student Health and Counseling Services, experience challenges, and win prizes.
- The April Lifeguard Certification Course reached full capacity with 16 students. The May course has just begun with 10 students. All lifeguard courses are taught by student certified instructors on staff. The SCUBA Courses are underway with 16 Open Water students (beginner course) and 2 Advanced/Deep Water students. Both the underwater rugby and underwater hockey clinics had 6 participants and exposed students to unique, fun ways to enjoy the pool. An end of the year Luau Pool Party sponsored by ASI and NPC is scheduled for Friday, May 29 from 6 to 10pm at the Pool (after Innertube Water Polo tournament). Hawaiian music, food, leis, giveaways, and pre-summer fun are all on the schedule for one of Campus Recreation's final events for the year.
- The Adventures staff have a variety of workshops and clinics coming up at the BRIC. Whoopsies on May 14 and May 21 from 7:00pm to 9:00pm is a free clinic that offers valuable information to participants about self-rescue, chopped rope, dropped belay device, and other potentially hazardous outdoor climbing scenarios. Slacklining on May 15 (101) and May 22 (201) will be happening out on the pool deck from 6:00pm to 8:00pm. Anchors 101 on May 19 from 7:00pm to 9:00pm is a workshop focused on educating participants how to determine how strong one's anchor should be when climbing outdoors as well as how to assess the component parts, and build up enough redundancy to feel secure with the set up process. Ian Navarro joined the ASI team this week as the Adventure Education Coordinator. He will be leading the Adventures team and related programs through the summer while Justin is out on an approved leave of absence.
