ASI Executive Director's Report

1. SUBJECT: Student Activities & Programs

DETAIL:

- The BroncoFusion Concert featuring B.o.B and after party at the BRIC Pool happened on Friday, September 25th with great success. Over 4000 CPP students came to the concert and about 600 attended the pool party.
- This Friday (October 2nd) is First Friday. There will be a glow dance in the Games Room from 9 p.m. to 12 midnight and an outdoor showing of Avengers: Age of Ultron at 9:30 p.m. in University Park.
- BEAT has participated in several tabling events to gear up for the fall quarter and recruit students as volunteers – BSC Night during Welcome Week, BroncoFusion Club Fair and BSC Open House.
- BEAT's first volunteer meeting of the quarter was held today during U-hour.
- BEAT's next event is Speed Friending on October 22nd at 7 p.m in Ursa Minor.
- The Student Activities & Programs department will be hosting a fall movie series in the BSC on Friday nights. The first movie will be Furious 7 on October 23rd at 7 p.m. in Ursa Major.

2. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation Program Updates

DETAIL:

- **Aquatics**
 - The summer usage totals for the BRIC pool from weeks 6/15/2015-9/15/2015 was 5,698. The majority of usage comes from lap swimmers totaling 1819, loungers coming in second at 1190, and KHP classes at 994 and Aquatics Programming at 923. Members also took advantage of the open recreational opportunities at the pool with open play usage of 636.
 - Aquatics has implemented several different types of programs this fall. From free classes, events to workshops on the deck, there is something for everyone offered at the BRIC Pool. Classes offered this year, which are free to BRIC members are Aqua Dance, Aqua Circuit Training, Aqua Mind, Body & Soul, and Underwater Sports. These classes introduce members to different aquatic fitness workouts into lifelong fitness and have fun with invigorating and challenging workouts

- Instructional clinics that are being offered this year are Masters Swim, Masters Water Polo, and Try-A-Tri. These programs offer members instruction from certified instructors. These clinics are \$30 and range between 6-10 weeks.
- We are hosting a BRIC Triathlon Sprint which is a .5mile swim, 12 mile bike ride, and 5k run on November 14th and its only \$5 for members to participate.
- American Red Cross certification courses being offered this fall are Lifeguarding Certification Course and Water Safety Certification (WSI) Course. The Lifeguarding course is \$175 for members and it includes CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer, and First Aid, registration closes November 6th. The WSI course begins on November 7th and the cost for members is \$175 and \$275 for non-members. SCUBA courses being offered SCUBA Discover SCUBA Diving (DSD) and SCUBA Open Water Certification Course with a San Diego Trip. The DSD classes offer members to try SCUBA out for those who are not ready to commit to the full certification course just yet. The DSD SCUBA clinic costs \$30 which includes all equipment and rental gear. The Open Water certification course cost is \$275 which includes all rental gear, hotel, transportation, and certification. This course begins October 9th!
- Campus Rec is excited to partner with CSU Channel Islands to offer the Waterfront Taster on Friday, October 16th. Members can experience a Day Trip to CSU Channel Islands that includes instruction for stand-up paddle boarding, kayaking, and sailing. No experience or equipment necessary, and the cost for this is \$35 for members.
- The BRIC pool will also be showing Nacho Libre and Pitch Perfect 2 on the pool deck this quarter during the Flick and Floats events. Dates will be announced soon.
- We currently have 4 Sport Clubs registered and are accepting up to 15 for the year. The current clubs are: Volleyball, Roller Hockey, Mixed Martial Arts and the Broncettes. They will begin traveling and competing as early as mid-October.
- **Fitness:**
 - The fitness department has a wide array of programs and services offered in fall 2015. As always fitness will be offering personal training along with small group trainings and regularly scheduled group fitness classes. Some exciting upcoming events for the quarter are Fall Cardio Challenge, Think Pink Boxing, Ride-in Movie, Olympic lifting workshops, mixed Martial arts workshops, the lunch & learn series and Couch to 5k.

- **Intramural Sports:**
 - IM Sports is currently registering teams for the fall quarter leagues—Soccer, Volleyball, Flag Football, and 3v3 Basketball. Leagues will begin on October 18th. Upcoming tournaments include Badminton, Capture the Flag, Ultimate Frisbee, Racquetball, Hantis, International Court Soccer, and College Bowl Pick ‘em. Hantis, Racquetball, and International Court Soccer have free Learn to Play sessions for anyone who is interested in learning a new sport.
- **Member Services:**
 - Over summer we had a total of 23,794 check-ins at the BRIC, with a weekly average of 1,586.
 - As of 9/29, we have 16,436 total members, including 75 paid members and 16,309 student assessed members, which is 70.83% of all 23,026 assessed students.
- **Operations:**
 - The Operations team is excited to bring an upgraded services for both the student staff and the Cal Poly Pomona community. They have recently completed the transition and on boarding of twenty-nine (29) new and returning Operations Attendants. This is a new frontline operations position that will provide BRIC members with excellent customer service while facilitating day-to-day usage and assistance in the activity spaces.
 - While all regular BRIC staff members are certified in CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer and Emergency Oxygen, the Assistant Operations Supervisors serve as the first responders with the additional Title XXII certification. The Operations team has also launched a new internal Campus Recreations program called the S.A.F.E. or Safety and Familiarity Exercises Program. This program is designed to assist student staff with on-the-job practice skills to feel more comfortable with all safety response skills in the work setting. It includes E.P.D.s or Emergency Preparedness Drills that are specific to each programmatic area. With all of these trainings and programs in place the Operations team is confident that the BRIC is one covered in case of emergency.
 - Operations will now be offering American Red Cross certifications for its members and the community for a low price. Operations will be hosting: CPR/AED + First Aid for the Lay responder, CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer + First Aid + Emergency Oxygen, and the CPR/AED for the Professional rescuer Instructor course. This will give students, members, and the Cal Poly Community an opportunity to not only learn these safety skills but also become certified to teach these skills. Certified instructors would then potentially have the opportunity to teach at the BRIC when positions open. The operations team is ready and excited for a new year and will continue to grow, in order to inspire and cultivate healthy and safe lifestyles in this inclusive environment.
