ASI Executive Director's Report

1. SUBJECT: CSU Audit Announcement Regarding Student Activities

DETAIL:

We received an email communication today confirming that the Chancellors Office will be performing an audit of student activities beginning on Monday, January 11, 2016 and responses to the Internal Control Questionnaire and requested documents are due by Friday, December 18, 2015. The CSU auditors are scheduled to be on campus from January 19-25. The Audit Exit Conference is planned for the week of February 1.

2. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation Program Updates

DETAIL:

- **Facilities**
 - A dozen volumes have been added to Bronco Peak's inventory and they will be added to the wall this Thursday in preparation for Dive and Climb which will be held on Friday November 13th. Volumes add dimension to the wall and will help with interesting route setting, and keeping Bronco Peak relevant, not only in the CSU's but within the broader local and regional climbing community.
 - ASI Campus Recreation just completed its new contract with LAVA Propane last week. Now, the 6 new deck heaters are available for ASI events just in time for the cold weather. The new deck furniture also arrived on November 3rd. The pool area has added bench seating around the perimeter of the lap lanes as well as two new longer tables have also arrived with twelve additional chairs to encourage socialization and gathering on the pool deck.
- **Classes**
 - Thirty-one people have completed the Climbing Wall Orientation and Belay class so far this November bring the total orientations completed to 207 for the fall quarter. Additionally, sixteen people have completed their Top Rope Assessments in the last nine days.
 - From October 22nd through November 8th, 744 participants checked in to group fitness classes.

- **Workshops**
 - Aid Climbing workshops continue through November 23rd. These workshops teach the foundational skills needed to tackle big wall climbs like the Nose on El Capitan in Yosemite.
- **Trips**
 - The next Joshua Tree trip will head out on November 14th. This trip is open to anyone including experienced climbers and persons who have never tried the sport before. On the 21st our Stonemasters program will finish their multi-week program with a trip to Joshua Tree to learn to lead Trad (traditional climbing).
 - The second Stroke Technique Workshop was held on Friday 11/6. There were 3 participants of all swim levels who received feedback and instruction from a certified instructor.
- **Leagues:**
 - Intramural Sports leagues registered 2,274 participants (1,326 unique participants) for 138 fall sports games including 3v3 basketball, soccer, flag football, and volleyball.
- **Certification Courses**
 - We had 8 participations attend and complete the 20 hour Wilderness First Aid certification course through the Wilderness Medicine Institute of NOLS taught by Justin Moynihan, Adventure Education Coordinator.
 - Currently there are seven students enrolled for the American Red Lifeguard certification course scheduled for the weekend of November 20th. This course will teach students the knowledge and skills to prevent, recognize and respond to aquatics emergencies, and provide care for breathing and cardiac emergencies, injuries, until EMS personnel take over.
- **Tournaments & Competitions**
 - This Friday's Dive and Climb will have a competition component, a lead climbing competition. Prizes for top climbers will include items donated from Liberty Mountain, Reel Rock, Cascade Designs, Balance Community, Supertopo, Madrock, and of course ASI.
 - The BRIC Sprint Triathlon will be held this Saturday, November 14th. This sprint triathlon will be hosted at the BRIC pool and will consist of a 5K run/12mile bike/.5mile run. This event is \$5 for member (\$15 non-members). Currently, 4 people are registered with more to come including members of the BRIC Triathlon Club.
 - The Badminton Tournament on October 23rd had a record number of participants who played in men's and women's singles and recreational and competitive doubles. Upcoming tournaments include International Court Soccer this Friday, November 13th at 3pm and Capture the Flag on Friday, November 20th at 3pm.

- **Events:**
 - Dive and Climb is coming up this Friday November, 13th. The event will begin at 5pm on the Pool deck with Tacos, Horchata, waterlining, slacklining, key-log rolling, watermelon wrestling, and the dive-in screening of Reel Rock 10. After the film, the action will move indoors for a friendly lead climbing competition featuring the volumes and new routes that we will be set on Thursday.
 - Aquatics hosted its first Thursday Night Flicks on November 5th with a total of 88 students in attendance. The students enjoyed the featured film, Nacho Libre, along with some Nachos from Qdoba. The next Thursday Night Flick will be on December 3rd featuring Pitch Perfect 2.
- **Services:**
 - As of November 8th, the BRIC has recorded 89,036 check-ins for the fall quarter. This equates to approximately 13,500 a week, 2,677 a day (Monday-Thursday), and 1,021 a day (Friday-Sunday). As of November 10th, the BRIC has a total of 17,379 members, including 17,125 (73%) assessed students and 203 paid members.
- **Incentive Programs:**
 - To date, the Fall Cardio Challenge is engaging 128 members to meet their cardio activity goals.
- **Staffing Changes/Updates:**

Lifeguards completed their In-Service training this Saturday. Lifeguard In-Service trainings are held the first Saturday of every month from 7-9am. These trainings review important safety topics, facility use updates, and emergency response updates. The Key Log Roller training was also held this Saturday, so all lifeguards are able to safely and correctly use and store this piece equipment.

Allyson Caudell will be joining the professional staff of Campus Recreation on Monday, November 30th filling the opening of Fitness Coordinator. She will be a great addition to ASI as she brings eight years of experience in the field of fitness and high level certifications.
- **Emerging Leaders (student staff training/development):**

Campus Recreation has just reviewed the first round of Emerging Leader applicants from its team of approximately 200 student employees. One of this year's student development opportunities is the American Red Cross Water Safety Instructor certification course. This course will prepare students the skills to teach, and gain terrific work experience as an aquatics professional. In addition students will learn organizational and presentation skills that will help in any career and make a difference in people's lives.
- **Professional Staff Training/Development:**

Shelbi Long, Associate Director of Recreation, is attending the NIRSA Region VI Conference in Honolulu, Hawaii this week. Shelbi is the Southern California State Director for NIRSA which comprises and supports leaders in collegiate recreation.

3. SUBJECT: Children's Center Updates

DETAIL:

- A donation of 100 pumpkins were received for the Pumpkin Harvest from a parent of an Agriculture Grad student. The children were each able to pick, harvest, and decorate their very own pumpkin to take home.
- The Annual Harvest Hat Day Parade occurred on Friday October 30th. Each of the four Children Center classrooms visited departments on campus, including the Foundation, BSC, OSLCC, and the CLA, and entertained Cal Poly Pomona staff by singing a few musical selections. The children were delighted with the treats they received, and returned to the Center happy and worn out.
- The Annual Children's Center Thanksgiving Luncheon is scheduled for Monday November 23, from 11:00 a.m. to noon in Ursa Major. A light lunch will be served followed by raffle drawings and entertainment from the children. ASI Senate and Cabinet members are invited to attend.

4. SUBJECT: Search for Vice President for Administrative Affairs/CFO

DETAIL:

Julian Herrera and I have been invited to sit on the search committee. The first meeting was held on Tuesday, 11/10. President Coley and the search firm of Isaacson, Miller met with the committee. The goal is to have a new VP appointed for a start date of July 1, 2016.

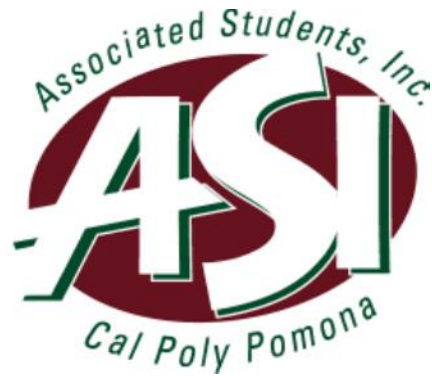
