



- WHEREAS, The Associated Students Incorporated (ASI) is the recognized voice of the student body at Cal Poly Pomona; and
- WHEREAS, The Instructionally Related Activities Advisory Committee (IRA) recommends funding allocation for IRA category organizations; and
- WHEREAS, The amount of funding requested and the number of IRA groups have increased since the last increase in the IRA fee, the IRA advisory committee is seeking input from students to determine whether or not to pursue a fee increase; and
- WHEREAS, The current IRA fee at \$40.00 per student per year, is the third lowest IRA fee in the CSU system; and
- WHEREAS, The fee supports organizations such as Bronco Athletics, Rose Float, Model United Nations, the Cal Poly Rodeo Team and others which bring reputation and credibility to Cal Poly Pomona's academic mission; let it be
- RESOLVED That the ASI Senate recommends the IRA Committee to pursue a fee increase of \$20.00 to \$40.00 and subsequently, subject to an annual inflationary adjustment on the timeline approved by the Committee on the February 21, 2012 meeting; and let it be further
- RESOLVED That the ASI Senate recommends the committee pursue alternative consultation to receive student input to solidify the demand for this proposed fee increase; and let it be
- RESOLVED That this resolution be forwarded to the ASI Senate, the IRA Advisory Committee, organizations funded by the IRA fee, the Fee Advisory Committee, ASI Business Services, University Vice-President for Student Affairs Dr. Doug Freer, Provost and Vice-President for Academic Affairs Dr. Marten denBoer and University President Dr. Ortiz.
