- Some highlights from Winter 2016: The first time offering Learn to Play Basketball and Learn to Play Volleyball sessions turned out over 30 participants to learn the basics of each sport and strengthen their skills. Sixteen CPP students participated in the CSU Channel Islands Waterfront Taster on Saturday, February 20th where they tried stand-up paddle boarding, kayaking and sailing.
