ASI Executive Director's Report

1. SUBJECT: BRIC Updates

DETAIL:

- The plaque (award) received at the NIRSA Annual Conference will be passed around the Senate table. The BRIC was selected as one of the Outstanding Sports Facilities at the national level.
- Save the Date! ASI will celebrate the BRIC's LEED Gold certification on the pool deck Tuesday, May 31st starting at 3:30pm. President Coley will join us for the festivities. The plaque is here (in Krista's office, for now) and it will be mounted following the celebration. More details to come.
- Daily average check-ins are up 3% from Spring 2015 averaging 2,728 Monday through Friday and 949 Friday through Sunday. Of 21,066 fee assessed students this quarter, 77.45% of have active memberships to the BRIC.

2. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation Updates

DETAIL:

- A new class was added to the Group Fitness Class schedule this quarter. In Aqua Cardio, participants can do a variety of swim cardio workouts without the stress on the joints. There is no charge to BRIC members for group fitness classes.
- The Campus Recreation staff participated in the spring department retreat. For four hours, 150 employees engaged in activities including Think Tank, Hot Topics with the Director, new program/equipment trials, teambuilding and other sessions in a conference style format with a theme focused on "Building Community".
