  1. Rideshare needs more awareness, incentives, and prime location
  2. The signals on Temple/S. Campus and Temple/University need to be timed to be safer for transit users and pedestrians

3. When widening S. Campus, the university needs to take into consideration bicycle lanes and safety
  4. The campus needs to upgrade the bus stops along Temple
  5. In order to pursue transit partnerships, we need to seek the locations of where students, faculty, and staff are commuting from to best cater their needs
  6. The Class Pass Program is something of interest to President Coley, but in need of more information and discussion especially with the Vice-President of Administrative Affairs
