Welcome Week: All Welcome Week Mentors and Front Desk Assistants (FDAs) have been moved in to their respective living spaces. While FDAs are trained in their buildings, Welcome Week preparation and training is well under way in preparation for all welcome week mentees next week (we are expecting roughly 1,200 residents).

IHC Recruitment: IHC is working implementing a newly revamped recruitment process that will rely more heavily on face-to-face interaction with residents, having informational booths scattered around at both welcome week and official move in days as well as casual information sessions in every single building the first evening of Welcome Week, in addition to an official presentation on the Tuesday of Welcome Week. Bulletin Boards are also being created in each building's lobby offering information and important dates for prospective members such as info nights and application deadlines. Finally, IHC is working more closely with the UHS staff (RAs and RLCs) to do preliminary searches for leadership talent and inform them of the opportunities IHC can offer.
