DETAIL:

FACILITIES: February 13th through February 19th, the BRIC had an average of 2,914 check-ins per day Monday through Thursday and 987 check-ins per day Friday through Sunday. As of February 20th, there are 18,721 student members which is 77.23% of the fee assessed students population (24,241).

NEW PROGRAMS: As part of Spirit Week, Intramural Sports will be hosting a 3-Point Shootout for Workout Wednesday. This event will be held at the BRIC Courts at 8 pm and will be a competition to score the most 3-point shots.

TRIPS: The Mt. Baldy Snow Day trip was rescheduled to next Saturday, March 4th due to weather. The course is full with 8 people in attendance and offers individuals an introduction to backcountry winter travel includes tools, packing techniques, movement, preparation, navigation, and snow skills as well a local outdoor trip to use these skills.

LEAGUES: Intramural Sports leagues are now more than halfway through their season, and playoffs will be starting March 6th.

CERTIFICATION COURSES: CPR/AED Lay Responder + First Aid course ran the second offering last week on Wednesday, February 15th at 4pm. Five members participated in this course where they were able to learn how to recognize and care for a variety of first aid emergencies. The BLS (Basic Life Support) series will have the last course offering Saturday, February 25th. Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers (BLS) uses a scenario-based approach to develop the critical thinking and problem solving skills that drive better patient outcomes. The certification course covers breathing and cardiac emergencies including CPR, AED, and obstructed airway for adult, child, and infant patients. The course is offered to BRIC members for \$65.

TOURNAMENTS/COMPETITIONS: This year's Quidditch Tournament on Friday, February 10th, hosted collaboration with the student club Dumbledore's Army, turned out fifteen participants which included a few University Police Officers who stopped by to join in on the fun. The next Intramural Sports tournament will be the Swim Meet this Friday, February 24th at the BRIC Pool.

Sport Clubs are have a number of competitions coming up. The Triathlon Club will be traveling to UCLA on February 26th and Cal Poly SLO on March 25th. Bronco Ascenders (Climbing Club) will be traveling to Mt. Rubidoux in Riverside on February 26th. Men's Volleyball will be traveling to UCR on February 25th and to USC on March 4th. Also on March 4th, Women's Volleyball will be at UCR. Men's and Women's Club Basketball will be competing in the NIRSA Regional Tournament at UCLA March 3rd, 4th and 5th.
