ASI Executive Director's Report

1. SUBJECT: Search for ASI Executive Director

DETAIL:

Heather Larabee, Search Associate for Spelman Johnson, was on campus on Monday, January 23, to meet with the Personnel Review Committee (PRC) and stakeholders in ASI and at the campus level. The Position Announcement has just been finalized and should be posted on or before January 31, 2017.

Heather presented the timeline and marketing approach to the PRC for review. The deadline for applications is March 17.

2. SUBJECT: Updates from Campus Recreation

DETAIL:

FACILITIES

Through January 22nd, the BRIC averaged 3,360 check-ins per day (Monday - Thursday) and 1103 check-ins per day (Friday - Sunday). As of January 23rd, there are 18,479 student members which is 76.18% of the fee assessed students population (24,257). Student members are up 171 from last week.

NEW PROGRAMS

Kettlebell training will have its first workshop on Friday, January 27th at 1pm. In this one hour workshop, participants will cover basic kettlebell form and technique, resistance style exercises, cardiovascular style exercises, and high intensity style exercises. The member will learn safe and effective exercises to incorporate kettlebells into daily routine. There are three kettlebell workshops in this program at a cost of \$5 per session.

WORKSHOPS

The Foam Rolling workshop begins on Friday, January 27th at 12pm. In this one hour workshop, participants will practice various foam rolling and stretching exercises focusing on the large muscle groups and core stability. Members that register and attend all three workshops will receive a free foam roller. Members will learn about the importance of flexibility and myofascial release and how foam rolling can improve activities of daily living and decrease muscle soreness and risk for injury. The techniques taught in the workshop can be incorporated in workouts. Each workshop costs \$5.

COURSES/CERTIFICATIONS

Through hands-on demonstrations, practical application and lecture material, the Group Fitness Instructor Prep Course provides the technique, knowledge and skills needed to successfully complete a national group fitness certification exam. The course meets on Fridays 10:00am to 12:00pm January 27th through March 3rd. Fee for BRIC Members is \$30.

3. SUBJECT: Updates from Children's Center

DETAIL:

What might you hear if you stopped by the Children's Center? Today you would hear lots of excited voices as the children are finally outside- the rain is difficult for them, as they LOVE the outdoors. In one classroom the children have been discussing our bones, and what they do - how our skull protects our brain, and our ribs protect our lungs and heart. They really enjoy the word phalanges, another word for our fingers and toes. In another classroom the children have built a pizzeria, and are busy making, ordering, and eating their delicious "food". They are finding out that there a lot of things that go into making their business successful!

The Children's Center is planning on having a Chinese New Years celebration, to be held on February 7th at 10:30. At 11:30 the preschool classes will go see how the Cultural Centers are celebrating the same event, and learn more about this holiday.

4. SUBJECT: Updates from the BSC

DETAIL:

ASI has received the draft Facility Condition Reports for the BSC and BRIC. The staff have a couple of weeks to review the report and provide the consulting firm with feedback and then the final report will be issued. At that point, the Facilities staff will work with Barny and Krista to review the recommendations on the condition of the facilities and develop some long and short term plans for the maintenance and system management for the two facilities. These reports are very detailed and technical and we expect this review and reporting to take some time.

Every year students request more ATM banking options on campus. ASI is currently the only ATM location on campus and provides the Bank of America and the CPP Credit Union machines. In doing our due diligence, the BSC Admin office reached out to Chase and Wells Fargo again this year, as ASI has done in the past, to see if they would consider installing an ATM in the BSC. Chase said no, but Wells Fargo may potentially be interested so the staff are pursuing this possibility in the hopes that another ATM could be placed next to Bank of America on the first floor of the BSC.

The Games Room hosted the Lost and Found Auction this week and made \$257 dollars that will be deposited into the scholarship account managed by Financial Aid. This is the smallest auction and the least amount of money made in recent years. This should be viewed as a positive outcome because it means that fewer lost items are being left unclaimed and therefore sold at the auction. The mission of the Lost and Found is for all lost items to be found and reclaimed by their owner so this is great news! Next quarter's auction will have several bikes so if you need a new ride make sure you stop by and put in your bid!
