3. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation Updates

DETAIL:

- May 1st – May 7th, the BRIC had an average of 3102.5 check-ins per day (Monday – Thursday) and 943 check-ins per day (Friday – Sunday). This reflects a 40% increase from this time last year. As of May 8th, there are 18,319 student members which is 79.36% of the fee assessed student population (23,083). This is an increase of 11.61% of student members compared to this time last year (16,413).
- Saturday, May 6th was Intramural Sports Night at the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes baseball game vs. the Inland Empire 66'ers. 25 tickets were distributed to BRIC members to attend the game.
- Campus Recreation has some great tournaments on the schedule the next two Fridays: Innertube Water Polo this Friday, May 12th and Goalball on Friday, 5/19.

- There are four registration spots remaining for this weekend's Joshua Tree Overnight trip. The trip is \$75 for BRIC members. Participants will focus heavily on trad climbing including placing and removing trad protection, building anchors, and leading trad.
- Seven registration spots remain for this Sunday's Mini Triathlon (\$5.00 registration fee). Participants from novice to advanced skill levels will complete a 400m swim in the BRIC pool, 20km on a spin bike, and 5km run around the outside of the BRIC.
