2. SUBJECT: Children's Center Update

DETAIL:

- The Children's Center toddler and preschool students were super excited to get new carpet in their classrooms and work done on the outdoor classroom. The biggest hit was the xylophone that was finally installed outside. The children are making all kinds of music! The new bike trail sidewalk connection was also a hit, as the children now have more open road to explore. The only down side is more traffic congestion as so many children are riding the bikes and scooters! A big thank you to Student Affairs for making these renovations possible.
- We are looking forward to new partnerships with the Kinesiology and Music departments. Kinesiology students will begin coming in the afternoon to work with our children on their gross motor skills, beginning Spring Quarter. We are hoping music department students will be coming soon and bringing down their instruments so that our children can learn all about different kinds of music, however a start date is not yet set. Being on campus here at Cal Poly Pomona exposes our young children to a world of diversity, and we hope their time here installs in them a desire and love for continuous learning.

3. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation Updates

DETAIL:

FACILITIES: During the last week of classes for the winter 2017 quarter, the BRIC recorded an average of 2,511.5 check-ins per day (Monday – Thursday) and 1,069.33 check-ins per day (Friday – Sunday) which is a 30.30% increase from last year at this time. As of March 13th, there are 18,828 student members which is 77.67% of the fee assessed student population (25,426). This is an increase of 11.36% of student members compared to this time last year (16,906).

In the Paralympics, Goalball is played by athletes who are visually impaired. All players wear eye masks to equalize visual impairment among the athletes. The ball makes noise when in motion so players can locate it audibly and tactile markings on the court allow the players to determine their location on the court and the direction they are facing while players take turns throwing the ball at each other's goal.
