DETAIL:

- We received some exciting news from LPA, the architectural firm for the BRIC. The BRIC was awarded the **2017 Excellence in Structural Engineering Award** from the National Council of Structural Engineers Association. This national award is among the highest honors given for structural design across the country. The BRIC was entered in the very competitive *New Construction* category making the win even more noteworthy.
- Fitness Coordinator, Allyson Caudell, and Fitness Supervisor, Jessica Garcia, attended the IDEA World Fitness Convention in Las Vegas, NV. They participated in various workouts, equipment demonstrations, and educational sessions. They also attended a Fitness Expo while at the conference to network with other fitness professionals in the field and learn about trending equipment and fitness programs. They plan to implement new and creative programming in the upcoming school year with new program offerings like P90X Live, reformer bar clinics, and building upon nutritional programming/education.
