**ASI Executive Director's Report**

**1. SUBJECT: Campus Recreation Updates**

**DETAIL:**

Campus Recreation and University Police (UPD) have been teaming up on a number of initiatives. Shelbi Long, Associate Director of Campus Recreation, served as the campus representative on the most recent Police Officer Search Committee to fill 4 open Officer positions. This is the second time in the last year that an ASI Campus Recreation employee has supported UPD in this capacity. Kaycee Tanioka, Intramural Sports and Sport Clubs Coordinator, is collaborating with UPD to facilitate a Conflict Management training session with Intramural Sports Officials this fall. Drew Caustrita, Facility Operations Coordinator, has been working with UPD to define the process to remove abandoned bikes from bike racks. To celebrate this partnership, UPD and Campus Recreation will face off at the inaugural Summer Kick Ball Game on Thursday, August 31<sup>st</sup> at 11:00am.

#### **4. SUBJECT: Bronco Student Center Updates**

##### **DETAIL:**

The BSC is getting a little interior facelift before the start of the school year. We just finished installing all new lounge furniture in the Upper Lobby, Mezzanine and Lower Rotunda to increase the seating options for students in the building. Many of the pieces of furniture have power plugs and USB ports so you can recharge your devices while you take a break between classes. We also installed several new trash/recycling bins that are not only useful, but informative by reminding people what items can be recycled and what has to go to the landfill.

Our BSC Reservations Coordinator Sue Wise retired after 25 years of service to ASI last month. A search committee has already interviewed three candidates on campus and we are in the process of making a decision and an offer.

President Coley has called an inter-divisional task force to review the operational impacts and action steps to prepare for semester conversion and ASI is represented on the task force. Next summer will be a short summer due to the spring quarter ending in mid-June and the fall semester starting in mid-August, which will impact ASI's and the campus' summer

schedules. ASI has already started to outline a conversion calendar that will include elections, starting/ending times for student leaders and the budget approval cycle, along with various events and activities.

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Last year's Senate approved the concept of creating the "Poly Pantry" a food pantry to be created in the BSC to address food insecurity among students. The BSC Director, Barny Peake, will lead a task force to research campus needs, define the operational and staffing plan, and outline a budget for the Poly Pantry. He is looking for student leaders to serve on this important task force. Any interested student leaders should notify Farris and he will select the student representatives to the task force. While ASI is developing the BSC's food pantry, the campus' mobile food pantry had a soft opening Tuesday, August 22 and handed out bags of non-perishable food to over 150 students in need! The mobile food pantry will be on campus once a month throughout the school year and more information will be coming to promote this valuable service in the fall.

The first big event for ASI in opening the year is CPP Fest, which is September 20<sup>th</sup>. This community development and campus orientation day is targeted toward all new incoming students and provides a full day of activities including departmental open houses, find your classes booths, fun activities, a club fair, and a keynote speaker. This leads in to the first day of classes where more activities are planned such as a break-the-record activity at U-hour, a pep rally and a movie showing in the evening. Finally, Friday is the big club fair and BroncoFusion concert! The Concert will be a ticketed and closed event as it was last year and the Student Activities & Programs staff are working hard to solidify the performers.
