Position Definition

Under minimal supervision from the Aquatics Coordinator, the Aquatics Assistant Supervisor oversees the daily operations of aquatic facilities and programs. The Aquatics Assistant Supervisor performs routine and complex assignments requiring specialized knowledge, prior relevant experience, and considerate independent judgment and decision-making.

Essential Duties

- Ensure that the surveillance and safety of participants in the aquatics facilities is maintained
- Assist with the overall management of the aquatics facilities and programs day-to-day operations
- Monitor programs serving participants under the age of 18 years old
- Serve as shift lead for daily operations
- Manage shift changes
- Assist in the supervision of lifeguards
- Assist with development and implementation of operational strategies
- Enforce rules and regulations regarding BRIC use
- Provide emergency care and treatment as required until the arrival of emergency medical services
- Present professional appearance and attitude at all times, and maintain a high standard of customer service
- Perform basic facility maintenance
- Prepare and maintain appropriate activity reports
- Perform lifeguard duties as needed
- Perform other related duties as assigned
- Attend and assist in development and execution of orientations and trainings

Qualifications:

- Current American Red Cross Lifeguard Training, CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer and Emergency Oxygen certifications. American Red Cross First Aid for Lifeguards and advanced first aid certification (Title 22, EMR, EMT) or equivalent. Lifeguard Instructor Certification, preferred.
- Candidate(s) selected for the position may be required to pass fingerprint clearance through the Department of Justice and complete a Child Abuse Index Form. This qualification is only required when monitoring programs serving children under the age of 18 years of age.
- Experience working in a fitness, recreation or similar environment
- Good health and physical/mental ability to perform the job requirements
- Must be able to swim 300 yards continuously using both front crawl and breast stroke
- Must be able to swim 20 yards, retrieve a 10-pound object and remove it from the pool within 1 minute, 40 seconds
- Ability to react calmly and effectively in emergency situations
- Ability to follow routine verbal and written instructions
- Ability to effectively communicate clearly and concisely, both verbally and in writing
- Ability to maintain professional work conduct
- Ability to make independent decisions and make recommendations
- Ability to adhere to work rules, follow directions, use time effectively and work productively without close supervision
- Demonstrated ability to work with a diverse student population and campus community
- Ability to operate a computer workstation using word processing, spreadsheet and other computer applications
- Ability to successfully pass a background screening as an offer of employment is contingent on background clearance

Work Environment

Work is typically performed outdoors in varying and occasionally extreme (hot) weather conditions. While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to use hands to finger, handle or feel; and reach with hands and arms. The employee is frequently required to climb or balance and occasionally stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl. The employee must occasionally sit for extended periods and regularly walk around the facility; talk and hear. The employee must frequently move 10 pounds occasionally lift and/or move up to 45 pounds, and be able to lift a person out of water. Specific vision abilities required but this job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and ability to adjust focus.

Position Sensitivity

Based on the duties and responsibilities of this position, this position has been designated to be a sensitive position.

Background Check

A background check (including a criminal records check) must be completed satisfactorily before any candidate can begin employment with Associated Students, Inc., Cal Poly Pomona. Failure to satisfactorily complete the background check may affect the application status of applicants or continued employment of current ASI employees who apply for this position.

Employment Eligibility:

Employment with ASI is open to any Cal Poly Pomona student who is eligible to work and has the legal right to work in the United States. In addition, the employee must be currently enrolled for at least 6.0 units (undergraduate) and 4.0 units (graduate) at the end of the add-drop period, have a minimum 2.0 GPA and be in good standing with the University. Individuals enrolled only in Extended University are not eligible for hire. Exceptions to the unit load requirement are allowed during the summer term and for students who have applied for graduation for the current term.
