Discussion of Action Item C: Additional Budget Request Roller Hockey Club

Hello, thank you for allowing us to come and represent the Roller Hockey club. This means a lot to us, and we are excited to share our club with you all. I believe introductions are in order because not many people know about our club. We are the roller hockey club, and we compete on the national level with the NCHRA, the same level as the NCAA. There are several regions: Western, Midwest, and Eastern. We currently participate in the West division. We are a coed team with 16 players, two of which are girls. We have an AA intermural team and a division III team. The NCRHA is a national competition that occurs every year. The nationals are held in different parts of the nation and this year it is in Maine from April 17-22nd. We are staying in Hilton Garden Inn with 10 students. 48 schools in the whole country are participating. The tournament is a single game elimination tournament. The benefits for CPP are that these games are streamed on the Internet for free and allow many people associated and not associated with the school to watch. By letting our team take part in this it will increase our school's athletic reputation. We have gone to nationals 4 times and have won the tournament once in 2003, finished in top 8 for 2018 and 2023, top 4 in 2019. We are ranked 15th across all the divisions. Our costs are \$450/student with ten students is \$4500. Rooms are \$166.67 per night. We will be booking 6 rooms for 6 nights which will cost about \$1000. Finally we will need 1 van rental which will be \$500. Our total budget for this year was \$13,730 and we have used \$13,050. This leaves us with a total of \$680 to use on our trip's cost of \$6000. In total we are requesting \$5320.
