Discussion Items

A. Black Thriving Initiative Update

[Black thriving update presentation]

Black thriving symposium next week ursa major from 9:00am to 12:00pm.

VP: That was amazing thank you for your work. We would love to be involved.

PRES: I recently found out our climate service is going to be postponed for at least half a year.

What are the interim plans to fill the gap of climate service not moving forward?

DR. GRADY: We are in polarizing times things are changing, our president is retiring we are looking at students being impacted. Potentially launching now, it could put on a spotlight and could do more harm. Working with deans and training with faculty, they are unaware of who we serve. In faculty training, the question was asked what percent of our students are first to go to college, it's 55% they were shocked. Led to another conversation about quick assumptions, if a student is late you get a penalty, assignment turned in late take points off. If we understand why the assignment was late or they are late to class because the bus was late. Maybe students don't have stable internet so they can't turn in assignments on time. If faculty is not aware of the situations of students, we can't progress. Workshops led by Tim Wise to engage folks in these conversations. If people aren't aware, it's hard to talk about accountability. Most people on campus would say they are here to serve students and don't want to harm. If we can all agree on that, that is our foundation. If they've never engaged in conversation, they can build something not in line with the foundation. This has to be a priority we will never close the equity gap if it's not. We believe the foundational component is key. We have been stressing cultural framework, if we aren't learning about other people, we will never get there. In polarizing times, we can't engage in cancel culture. We are getting people to understand that what impacts one impacts all ENV: the current administration is set on putting frameworks to dismantle things such as DEI, how can we persevere through these efforts?

DR. GRADY: This is a student success focus program not DEI program. Folks don't understand was DEI means. This is about persistence and retention.

JENELLE: Regardless of how things are weaponized this is how it's being used.

DR. GRADY: People hear thriving initiative they think DEI and think does not apply to them. We serve the student 53% identify as Latino 3% identify as black. We have to focus on the data and who it affects. Important to highlight the conversations are not just about recent executive orders there have been bans on DEI order even before current admin only 8 states didn't have a ban on DEI. We have been researching other states to see how they are seeing and thinking about

the work. Work is happening but how they talk about it different what is the true purpose of the initiative. As the chancellor put out the CSU system despite executive order commitment to serving all students will never change. As long as it doesn't change, and we know who we serve at CPP then there is a commitment to student success not DEI. We are updating websites and having conversations, so people are being proactive for what's to come. We will not lose sight of why we have the initiative.
