- CSSA Monthly Meeting (agenda) Systemwide Affairs Committee Report (agenda)
 - Resolution to Establish a System-wide CSU Undocumented Student Advisory Council Framework for Comprehensive Support Framework (draft of resolution - link)
 - Brought forward by a few of the committee members
 - Noticed a need to support the undocumented student population of the CSU, especially during these times
 - The resolution will be a call to action directly to the Chancellor's office and to CSSA
 - create a committee where this topic can be discussed and concerns can be addressed & have the Chancellor's office take action
 - In the next meeting, we will approve this resolution to be brought to the CSSA Board of Directors
 - Other Conduct of Concern Guidance Document (link)
 - The entire CSU has been conducting a systemwide assessment of Title IX
 - Cozen O'Connor Institutional Response Group is the organization conducting the assessment (so if you hear Cozen O'Connor report now you'll know what it's referring to)
 - The report found that there is concern around Other Conduct of Concern or OCC
 - = conduct that does not violate CSU policies or local/state/federal laws and does not warrant disciplinary action
 - = conduct that negatively impacts the learning, living, and working environment of the CSU community including but not limited to bullying, bias, micro-aggressions or harassment, etc.
 - This guidance document has just recently been released to campuses on Jan. 31st
 - Hoping to see communication from the University soon and changes/updates on the Report @ CPP website (link)
 - The committee discussed concerns regarding the "grey area" within OCC
 - Will there be a difference defined between harmful speech and free speech?
 - o Does this hinder students' free speech?
 - o Will students simply try to silence others?
 - How will this concern be addressed? trainings for staff and communication to students/campus
